

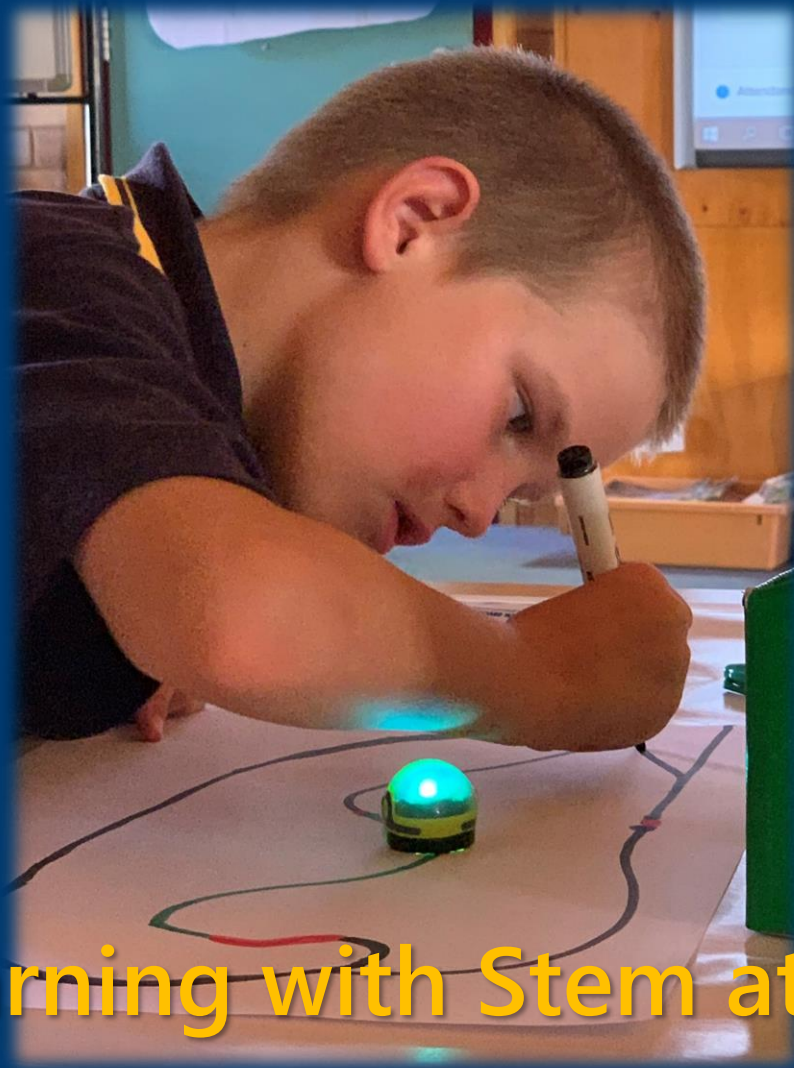

We look at the areas in which students need reminding of expected behaviour and teach lessons to support them. It is important that students follow instructions in all settings of our school and when out of the school grounds. It helps to maintain a safe and harmonious learning and play environment.

## News from the Classroom

It has been a whirlwind start to term 3 in Muliyan. I have been so impressed with the ability of my students to get back into their learning without skipping a beat after school holidays. They have shown respect and maturity when interacting with each other, visitors and when taking part in additional activities in and out of school. It is safe to say, I am one proud teacher!

This term during Literacy we will be busy extending upon the impressive gains we have made so far this year. We will be continuing to improve upon the level of sophistication of the texts we are reading both as a class and during group work. In writing, we will be focusing upon the information text type which will allow us to have some crossover between Geography and Science and complete research tasks.

During Mathematics, we will be looking at concepts involving time, volume, capacity and mass before moving on to consolidating and revising concepts and strategies we have already looked at throughout the year. It is definitely 'go time' in maths and end of year assessments will be upon us before we know it.

Everybody is enjoying Science due to the amazing variety of activities and equipment on offer. The use of a 3D printer has definitely been a hit and everybody has been enjoying utilising the Ozobots and coding software. In Geography we will be exploring how people use different types of environments before moving back into a gold rush focus.

We have had a number of exciting opportunities in our learning already this term. We really enjoyed our trip to Wagga Wagga to watch the performance of Hitler's Daughter. This was a great complement to our novel study and the theatrical version really helped bring the pages of the book to life. We have also enjoyed the Footsteps dance program and the disco that was run by the Footsteps instructors. Information has gone home regarding our end of year excursion and we cannot wait to go to Ballarat.
