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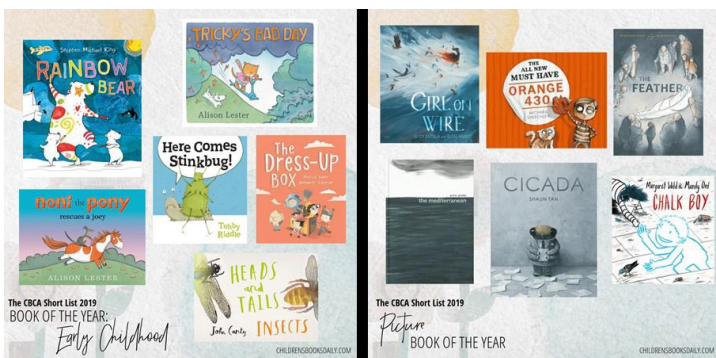


## Principal's Note

### Book Week

Book Week is an annual event celebrating quality Australian literature, authors and illustrators. This year's theme is 'Reading is My Secret Power'. It is a great opportunity for our students to celebrate their love of books and reading by dressing up as their favourite book characters or superheroes. Students will be involved in a 'Read In', where members of the community and special guests will read books to them from 9:30 to 11:30am. We then invite parents, carers and friends to join us for a BBQ lunch followed by the much anticipated book character parade at 12:10pm. Members of the school community are welcome to come along and watch the parade and younger siblings are encouraged to dress up as well. ### Education Week

Earlier this term we celebrated Education Week. I would like to thank our students and staff for making our Open Day the huge success it was. Unfortunately I couldn't attend as I was away on long service leave, but I have heard such positive comments about the Maths activities, learning display and dance performance and how much our parents and community members enjoyed the day. Thank you for celebrating our students and public education. I think the photos in this newsletter, speak volumes.

### Envision Hands

Our school is currently supporting a company called Envision Hands, by collecting plastic bottle caps so they can be recycled to make prosthetic hands for children in need. Their mission is to create 100 bespoke aids out of bottle caps using 3D printers. Bottle caps are fully recyclable. Unfortunately, as reported on ABC's 'War on Waste', evidence suggests that plastic bottle tops aren't being recycled. They get sent to landfill, they fall through machinery, and in worst case scenarios, if attached to a bottle, they can explode and force expensive re packing issues.

This overlooked waste product is almost entirely made from HDPE 2 (High Density Poly-Ethylene). After considerable experimentation this company have successfully taken this plastic and extruded it to create functioning filament for 3D printers. Once they have the filament they use 3D printers to create all the components that make up the hand. We hope you can support this worthy cause. Please send in plastic bottle caps only and take them to the canteen.







## PBL

This fortnight we are focusing on *caring for others*. *Caring for others* is part of being respectful and inclusive. It is vital that all students feel welcome and have a sense of belonging at June Public School. We model and encourage empathy in our students and when they are able to put themselves in others shoes they are more able to be caring and considerate.

We are looking at our Anti bullying procedures and when talking to students about bullying they often talk about the need to be able to tell a trusted peer and adult if they feel unsafe or have witnessed 'unkind' behaviour. We will continue to review the ways students can share concerns.

Students who *care for others* will receive Dojos which they be able to spend at the upcoming 'Dojo Shop'.

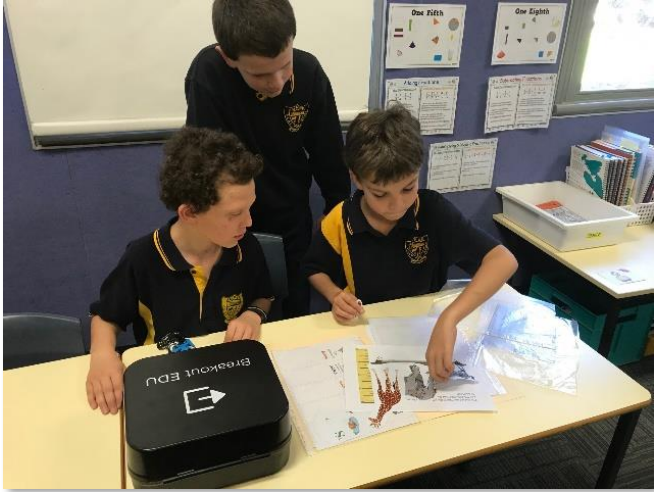
