Each fortnight staff review the behaviour data collected on Sentral. This data is analysed and used to choose a teaching focus. Explicit teaching of expected behaviours underpins or PBL processes and reminds students of behaviour expected of them in all settings. This fortnight our PBL focus is **Hands and feet to self**. Students are reminded of why it is important to keep their hands and feet to themselves and the way it supports a friendly and calm learning and play environment at school. Students are taught alternate ways to gain peer attention and strategies they can use when solving problems.

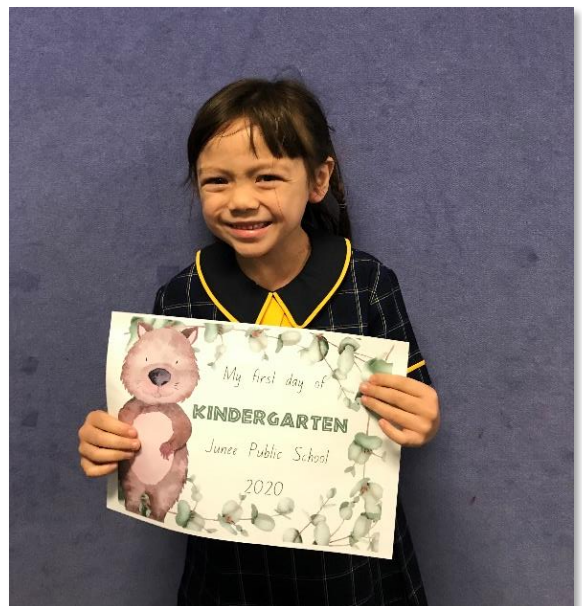
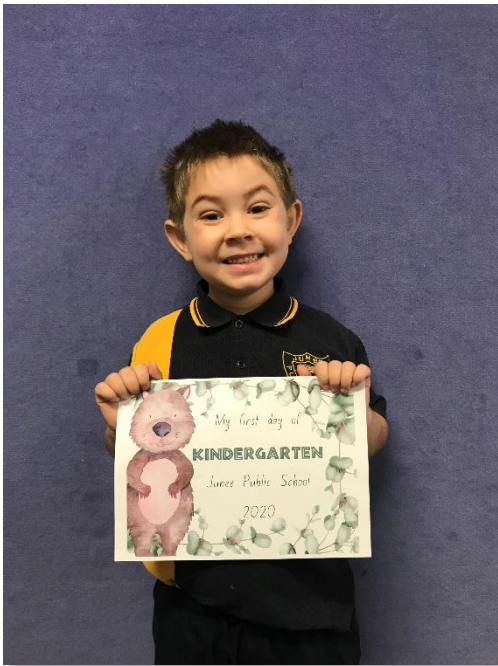
